### **NOTICE NO. 22 – 25 MARCH, 2026**

The SECRETARY OF HIGHER EDUCATION OF THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION (MEC), in the exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Article 87, sole paragraph, item I, of the Constitution, in accordance with the powers provided for in articles 21, items V, X and XII, and 23, item XVII of Decree No. 11,342, of January 1, 2023, and considering the provisions of Decree No. 11,923, of February 15, 2024, and Interministerial Ordinance MEC/MRE No. 7, of June 4, 2024, hereby announces the opening of registrations and other procedures related to the Selection Process for the Undergraduate Student-Agreement Programs (PEC-G) and Portuguese as a Foreign Language (PEC-PLE) for the academic year 2027.

#### 1. CONCEPTUALIZATION

1.1. The Undergraduate Student Agreement Program (PEC-G) and the Portuguese as a Foreign Language Program (PEC-PLE), jointly administered by the Secretariat of Higher Education of the Ministry of Education (SESu/MEC) and the Division of Educational Cooperation of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (DCE/MRE), are modalities of the Student Agreement Program (PEC) aimed at the training and qualification of foreign students through the offer of free places in on-campus undergraduate and Portuguese language courses at Brazilian Higher Education Institutions (*Instituições de Educação Superior*, henceforth IES).

1.2. The PEC constitutes a set of activities and procedures for international educational cooperation, complementary to other initiatives, based on existing bilateral agreements, and is characterized by the training and qualification of foreign students through the offer of places in Portuguese language courses, or undergraduate, or postgraduate (*stricto sensu*) levels in Brazilian higher education institutions, with the expectation that the student will return to their country of origin at the end of the course or, in the case of courses with mandatory internships and supervised activities, whenever possible, immediately before their completion.

#### 2. OBJECT

2.1. This call for applications will select up to 1400 (one thousand four hundred) national candidates from countries participating in the Program, as per item 16 of this Call for Applications, to attend in-person Portuguese language and undergraduate courses at Brazilian Higher Education Institutions (IES) offering places in this Selection Process, distributed as follows:

- a) Concurrent places for PEC-PLE (2027) and PEC-G (2028): up to 700 (seven hundred) places.
- b) Places exclusively for PEC-G (entry in 2027): up to 700 (seven hundred) places.

#### 3. PLACES

3.1. The places offered by the IES participating in the PEC-G refer to in-person full undergraduate courses, in any area of knowledge, preferably during the day or full-time, with a planned duration of 4 (four) to 6 (six) years, depending on the course and the institution.

3.2. The places offered by the participating IES in the PEC-PLE program refer to in-person courses in Portuguese as a foreign language and Brazilian culture, with a planned duration of up to 1 (one) year, for candidates who need to obtain the Certificate of Proficiency in Portuguese for Foreigners (Celpe-Bras).

3.3. Regardless of the number of places offered by the participating IES, the number of selected applications will adhere to the limit specified in item 2.1 of this Notice, considering the number of active PEC-PLE and PEC-G students in Brazil and the capacity of the IES to accommodate them.

3.4. The list of participating IES and information about the courses offered, including area of knowledge, type of degree, campus, semester of entry, number of places and any observations, will be published on the DCE/MRE website (<https://www.gov.br/mre/pt-br/assuntos/cultura-e-educacao/temas-educacionais/programas-de-estudo-para-estrangeiros/pec-g/processo-seletivo>), within the deadline defined in item 6 of this Notice.

3.5. Those selected through this selection process for admission to the PEC-PLE will occupy places in Portuguese as a foreign language and Brazilian culture courses starting in the first semester of 2027.

3.6. Those selected through this selection process for admission to the PEC-G will occupy places in the first semester of the undergraduate course to which they are assigned, as follows:

3.6.1. Those selected directly for the PEC-G will occupy undergraduate places in the first or second semester of 2027.

3.6.2. Those selected simultaneously for the PEC-G and PEC-PLE programs, who will take the course in Portuguese as a foreign language and Brazilian culture in 2027, will occupy undergraduate places to be offered by the participating IES in 2027 and announced in due course, in accordance with item 13.2.2, in 2028, provided they obtain certification in the Celpe-Bras exam.

3.6.3. Exceptionally, the selected candidates mentioned in item 3.6.2 may occupy undergraduate places in the second semester of 2027, provided they obtain certification in the Celpe-Bras exam applied in the first semester of 2027 and if there is a remaining place available within the 2026 Selection Process that corresponds to the option indicated by the candidate, sufficient time for enrollment, and agreement from the respective Higher Education Institution (IES).

#### 4. REQUIREMENTS FOR REGISTRATION

4.1. Registration for the PEC-G and PEC-PLE 2026 Selection Process (entry in 2027) is free of charge and must be carried out at one of the Brazilian diplomatic or consular representations (hereinafter referred to as "posts") in a country participating in the Program, as per item 16 of this Notice.

4.1.1. Exceptionally, due to the current security situation in Haiti, applications will not be accepted at the Brazilian Embassy in Port-au-Prince. Haitian citizens may apply at posts in other participating countries of the Program.

4.2. Foreigners who meet the following criteria may apply for the 2026 Selection Process of the PEC-G and PEC-PLE (entry in 2027):

a) do not hold dual Brazilian nationality or have the right to Brazilian nationality on the date of application;

b) are nationals of a participating country in the PEC, residing abroad and not holding any type of visa or residence permit for Brazil, except for a tourist visa;

c) are at least 18 years old by January 1, 2027;

d) submit a Declaration of Financial Responsibility signed by financial guarantor(s) guaranteeing the coverage of their expenses in Brazil throughout the entire study period;

e) Sign a Commitment Agreement in which you agree to comply with the rules of the Program;

f) Prove completion of the equivalent of high school education in a country other than Brazil; and

g) In the case of a candidate who wishes to compete exclusively for the PEC-G program for admission to an undergraduate course in 2027, submit, by the date stipulated in the calendar of this selection process, the Celpe-Bras certificate, or an Intermediate level certificate in a Portuguese language course taught by a unit of the *Instituto Guimarães Rosa* (IGR) network.

4.2.1. Candidates who have taken Portuguese as an official language throughout their secondary education, and who do not possess a Celpe-Bras certificate or an intermediate-level certificate from a Portuguese course offered by a local unit of the *Instituto Guimarães Rosa* (IGR) network, must have an overall average in secondary education Portuguese language equal to or greater than 65% (sixty-five percent), as per item 12.3, letter "f" of this Notice, except in the case of candidates who completed secondary education or equivalent level in Timor-Leste or Equatorial Guinea.

4.2.2. Candidates who complete the equivalent of secondary education by the end of 2026 may apply and must present the respective certificate at the time of enrollment in the Brazilian higher education institution, if selected.

4.2.3. Participation is prohibited for Brazilian citizens, even those with dual nationality, as well as candidates whose parent is Brazilian.

4.2.4. Candidates selected in previous PEC-G selection processes who failed to complete their initial registration at the Higher Education Institution (IES) without justification are prohibited from registering, as are students who were previously dismissed from the Program and candidates who were disqualified in previous selection processes due to fraud or falsification of the submitted documentation.

## 5. PARTICIPATION IN PEC-PLE

5.1. Candidates who have not taken Portuguese as an official language course throughout their secondary education and who do not possess the documents stipulated in item 4.2, letter "g" of

this Notice must register for both PEC-PLE and PEC-G simultaneously. If selected, they must take the Celpe-Bras exam in Brazil, optionally in the first semester of 2027, and mandatorily in the second semester of 2027, after completing the course in Portuguese as a foreign language and Brazilian culture at a designated IES within the scope of PEC-PLE.

5.2. Candidates selected for the PEC-PLE program who obtain certification in the Celpe-Bras exam administered in the second semester of 2026 may be exempt from taking the Portuguese as a Foreign Language and Brazilian Culture course and from taking the Celpe-Bras exam in Brazil. In this case, they may enter the PEC-G program in 2027, provided there is sufficient time for enrollment, a remaining place available within the 2026 Selection Process, and agreement from the respective Higher Education Institution (IES). If it is not possible to enter the PEC-G program in 2027, the candidate may be assigned to an undergraduate place with entry in 2028.

5.3. In the event of non-certification in the Celpe-Bras exam administered in the first or second semester of 2027, the Higher Education Institution (IES) where the PEC-PLE program was conducted may authorize the student in this modality to take the exam in the 2028 edition, and must promptly notify the Ministry of Education (MEC) and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MRE).

5.4. A PEC-PLE student who obtains certification in the Celpe-Bras exam administered in the first semester of 2028, as authorized by the PEC-PLE IES, may occupy a place in an undergraduate course starting in the second semester of 2028, provided there is sufficient time for enrollment, a place is available, and the respective IES agrees.

5.5. The IES where the PEC-PLE program is conducted may decide the maximum number of times a PEC-PLE student may take the Celpe-Bras exam before being permanently removed from the Program.

5.6. Students enrolled in the PEC-PLE program who do not pass the proficiency exam, after the maximum number of attempts allowed by their institution, will be removed from the Program and will not be able to enter the PEC-G program or compete again for places in the Program.

## 6. PROJECTED CALENDAR

6.1. The dates presented in the tables below will be used as a reference for the organization of the 2026 Selection Process for PEC-G and PEC-PLE (entry in 2027) and are subject to change.

## 7. SELECTION PROCESS FLOW

7.1. The 2026 Selection Process for PEC-G and PEC-PLE (entry in 2027) will follow the following steps, whose deadlines are listed in item 6 of this Notice:

7.1.1. Pre-registration: interested parties who meet the requirements set forth in item 4 of this Notice must complete and submit an online pre-registration form, available at the link <https://pec.mec.gov.br/pre-inscricao-candidato/iniciar-inscricao>, according to the guidelines in item 8 of this Notice. In the pre-registration form, interested parties must provide the requested information, including the overall average of high school or equivalent level, as well as attach a scanned copy of the complete high school transcript or equivalent level.

7.1.2. Pre-classification: the Brazilian diplomatic or consular posts will analyze the pre-registrations received in their jurisdictions and perform the pre-classification of candidates according to the criteria defined in item 9 of this Notice.

7.1.3. Submission of documentation and document analysis by the Brazilian diplomatic or consular posts: the Brazilian diplomatic or consular posts will contact the pre-classified candidates, observing the application limit, as per item 10.1 of this Notice, for the submission of the required registration documents, in printed and digital format, as per item 10 of this Notice.

7.1.4. Registration: the Brazilian diplomatic or consular posts will carry out, on the Program's digital platform (hereinafter referred to as "SISPEC"), the registration of pre-classified candidates whose documentation meets the provisions of item 10 of this Notice. For registration, the candidate will have two options: they may indicate only a course option, in which case they will compete for all places in that course offered by the participating institutions; or they may opt for a specific place in a course, indicating the specific IES, undergraduate modality, campus, and semester of entry. In this case, the candidate will be limiting their participation only to the selected place. Only applications submitted completely and correctly to SISPEC by the deadline defined in item 6 of this Notice will be considered for selection.

7.1.5. Selection: The Selection Committee will distribute the registered candidates among the places offered and, if necessary, establish a waiting list. A new document analysis of the selected applications will be carried out. Applications whose documentation is incomplete or contains inconsistencies will be disqualified, and the open places will be allocated to candidates on the waiting list.

7.1.6. Publication of those selected in the first call: SESu/MEC and DCE/MRE will publish the list of those selected in the first call, the waiting list, and the list of remaining places available, prepared as defined in item 13.4.

7.1.7. Period for selected candidates to express their acceptance: those selected in the first round must inform the post where they registered whether they have accepted the offered position(s), withdrawn from the Selection Process, requested a change of position to one of the remaining available positions, or requested inclusion on the waiting list to fill a position offered to another candidate. The post must register the selected candidates' expressions of acceptance in SISPEC.

7.1.8. Confirmation of those selected in the first round: SESu/MEC and DCE/MRE will publish the confirmation of those selected in the first round and the updated waiting list, if any.

7.1.9. Publication of those selected in the second and third rounds: in case of withdrawals after the confirmation of those selected in the first round, SESu/MEC and DCE/MRE may publish a list of those selected in the second and third rounds.

## 8. PRE-REGISTRATION

8.1. Those interested in registering for the Selection Process must first complete, within the deadline indicated in item 6 of this Notice, the pre-registration form available at: <https://pec.mec.gov.br/pre-inscricao-candidato/iniciar-inscricao>.

8.1.1. When completing the pre-registration form, the interested party must:

a) correctly fill in all mandatory fields;

- b) select the country and Brazilian diplomatic or consular post where they wish to register;
- c) indicate a frequently consulted email address and a telephone number through which they can be contacted by the Brazilian diplomatic or consular post where they wish to register and by the IES, if selected;
- d) provide their overall high school average or equivalent level, calculated according to item 8.2 of this Notice; e) Attach a legible, scanned copy of your complete high school transcript or equivalent, containing a list of all subjects taken and all grades obtained, accompanied by a simple translation into Portuguese, English, French, or Spanish, if the transcript is not in one of these languages.

8.1.2. The transcript and, where applicable, its translation, must be attached as a single file, in PDF format, with a size of up to 10 MB and quality that allows for full readability of the document.

8.1.3. The academic transcript must contain signatures and stamps or an electronic validation code from the issuing institution, or authentication from the responsible authority of the country where the document was issued, or another form of legalization required by the Brazilian diplomatic or consular post where the candidate intends to register.

8.2. The overall average for high school or equivalent level must be obtained by the simple arithmetic mean of the grades of all subjects taken up to the date of pre-registration.

8.3. Pre-registration constitutes a preliminary stage of the Selection Process and does not imply automatic acceptance of the application. Only pre-classified candidates, as per item 10.1 of this Notice, will be called for the next stage.

8.4. It is the candidate's sole responsibility to:

- a) monitor the status of their pre-registration, being entirely responsible for technical problems, data transmission failures, or filling errors that prevent the submission of the pre-registration form; and
- b) regularly check the email address provided during pre-registration to receive any communications from the Brazilian diplomatic or consular post where you intend to register.

## 9. PRE-CLASSIFICATION

9.1. After the pre-registration period, the Brazilian diplomatic or consular posts will pre-classify the candidates, observing the maximum number of candidates to be called for the document submission stage, which will be communicated to the Brazilian diplomatic or consular post by the DCE/MRE.

9.2. Pre-classification will be based on the overall average of high school or equivalent level.

9.3. In case of a tie in the overall average, the average of the official language subject will be considered as a tiebreaker. If this subject was not taken in all years of high school or equivalent level, the averages of subjects related to the use of the official language, such as literature or writing, may be considered. If the tie persists, the older candidate will be prioritized.

9.4. The offices will verify the data provided by the pre-selected candidates, including the overall average of high school or equivalent level, based on an analysis of the school transcript attached to the pre-registration form.

9.5. Pre-registration will be rejected in the following cases:

- a) incomplete form or form filled out in disagreement with the provisions of this Notice;
- b) candidate under 18 (eighteen) years of age by the date indicated in item 4.2;
- c) duplicate pre-registration for the same candidate, with only the last pre-registration being considered valid;
- d) illegible digitized school transcript, which makes complete or partial verification of the data impossible;
- e) absence of the complete school transcript in the pre-registration;
- f) absence of a translation of the complete school transcript into Portuguese, English, French, or Spanish, if the document is not in one of these languages;
- g) Academic transcript that does not contain signatures and stamps or electronic validation code from the granting institution, or authentication from the responsible authority of the country where the document was issued, or other form of legalization required by the post; and
- h) Academic transcript issued in Brazil, as per item 4.2, letter "f" of this Notice.

9.6. The list of pre-classified candidates will be published on the DCE/MRE website (<https://www.gov.br/mre/pt-br/assuntos/cultura-e-educacao/temas-educacionais/oportunidades-de-estudo-para-estrangeiros/pec-g/processo-seletivo>), within the deadline defined in item 6 of this Notice.

## 10. SUBMISSION OF DOCUMENTATION AND DOCUMENT VERIFICATION BY THE POSTS

10.1. After the pre-classification stage, the positions will summon the pre-classified candidates to submit the required documentation for registration, observing the maximum number of candidates per position to be informed by the DCE/MRE.

10.2. The selected candidate must present the following documents to the Brazilian diplomatic or consular post where the candidate applies within the deadline indicated in item 6 of this Notice:

- a) Original and copy of high school diploma or equivalent document, or, in the case of a candidate who will not have completed high school by the registration date, a declaration of probable graduation by the end of 2026;
- b) Original and copy of the school transcript with a list of all subjects taken and grades obtained during high school or equivalent level;
- c) Original and copy of one or more valid official documents proving the nationality of the candidate and their parents, such as: birth certificate, passport, identity card or other equivalent official document accepted by the Brazilian diplomatic or consular post where the candidate applies;

d) Original of the Declaration of Financial Responsibility(s), in Portuguese, duly completed, signed and dated;

e) Proof(s) of income of the signatory(ies) of the Declaration of Financial Responsibility(s) that allows identification of a regular source of income compatible with the commitment assumed and with the selection criteria set forth in item 5.3(d) of this Notice;

f) Copy of an official identification document, with photo and signature, of the signatory(ies) of the Declaration of Financial Responsibility(s);

g) Original of the Commitment Agreement for Registration, in Portuguese, duly completed, signed and dated, except if the position chooses to generate the aforementioned Agreement already completed by SISPEC, for the candidate's signature at the time of registration; e

h) For candidates applying only for the PEC-G program and who do not meet the condition stipulated in item 4.2.1, the original and a copy of the Celpe-Bras approval certificate, in any edition, or proof of registration for the first semester 2026 edition of the Celpe-Bras exam, or a certificate of completion of an Intermediate level Portuguese language course from a unit of the Instituto Guimarães Rosa (IGR) network. Candidates who meet the condition stipulated in item 4.2.1 and who possess any of the aforementioned documents may also, at their discretion, present them.

10.3. With the exception of the Declaration of Financial Responsibility(s) and the Commitment Agreement for Registration, which must be in Portuguese, all other registration documents must be submitted along with a simple translation into Portuguese, English, French, or Spanish, except in cases where the documentation is already in one of these languages.

10.4. The candidate must submit all required documentation in printed and digital format.

10.5. The digital documentation must meet the following specifications: a single file for each document, in PDF format and a size of up to 10 MB, with quality that allows for full readability.

10.6. The Brazilian diplomatic or consular post where the candidate applies will inform the candidate of the accepted methods for submitting the digital documentation.

10.7. The templates for the Declaration of Financial Responsibility and the Commitment Agreement for Registration are available on the DCE/MRE website (<https://www.gov.br/mre/pt-br/assuntos/cultura-e-educacao/temas-educacionais/oportunidades-de-estudo-para-estrangeiros/pec-g/processo-seletivo>).

10.8. The selection offices may establish methods, adapted to the local context, to verify the authenticity of the documents presented, including through the requirement of legalizations or consultation with local authorities.

10.9. In countries where the issuance of the high school diploma or equivalent level occurs after the deadline for registration in the Selection Process, a declaration of completion of high school or equivalent level issued by the school or education system where the candidate studied will be accepted on a provisional basis.

10.10. Each Declaration of Financial Responsibility must be signed by a natural or legal person, provided that this person is responsible for the candidate's subsistence in Brazil throughout the study period.

10.11. Candidates with more than one source of funding must submit Declaration of Financial Responsibility completed and signed separately by each of the financial guarantors, indicating the amounts to be transferred to the candidate.

10.12. The Declaration of Financial Responsibility must have the signatory's signature notarized or another form of legalization to be defined by the office where the registration will be carried out.

10.13. One or more of the following documents may be accepted as proof of income for a financial guarantor who is a natural person, at the discretion of the post:

- a) income tax return, provided it allows for the identification of continuous income;
- b) statement from the employer indicating the net monthly income of the financial guarantor;
- c) pay stubs from the three months prior to the submission of the documentation;
- d) bank statements from the three months prior to the submission of the documentation;
- e) employment contract indicating the net monthly remuneration of the financial guarantor; and
- f) other documents to be defined by the post where the registration will be carried out, provided they allow for verification of the net monthly income of the financial guarantor.

10.14. If the financial guarantor is the candidate themselves, one or more of the following documents may be accepted as proof of income, at the discretion of the post:

- a) bank statements, provided they allow for the identification of continuous income;
- b) investments;
- c) savings;
- d) employment contract;
- e) Service provision contract; and
- f) Other documents defined by the post where registration will be carried out, provided they prove that the candidate has sufficient financial resources to cover their stay in Brazil for the entire study period or that they will have a lawful and continuous source of income in Brazil, compatible with the requirements of item 12.3, letter "d", of this Notice.

10.15. One or more of the following documents may be accepted as proof of income for a legal entity financial guarantor, at the discretion of the post:

- a) Articles of incorporation;
- b) Income statement;
- c) Income tax return; and
- d) Other documents to be defined by the post where registration will be carried out.

10.16. In the case of a public legal entity financial guarantor, such as government agencies and international organizations, the presentation of proof(s) of income may be waived, at the discretion of the post where registration will be carried out.

10.17. The financial guarantor residing outside the candidate's country of origin must send the documents mentioned in points "e", "f", and "g" of item 10.2 to the Brazilian diplomatic or consular post where the candidate's registration will take place.

10.18. If the signatory(ies) of the Declaration of Financial Responsibility(s) do not possess an official identification document with a photo and signature, the Brazilian diplomatic or consular post where the registration will take place will decide, upon presentation of justification to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MRE), which alternative documents may be accepted to prove the identity of the signatory(ies).

10.19. The Commitment Agreement for Registration may be signed at the time of registration at the Brazilian diplomatic or consular post or submitted along with the other documents listed in item 10.2 of this Notice.

10.20. With the exception of the Declaration of Financial Responsibility(s), the other original required documentation will be returned to the candidate after verification by the Brazilian diplomatic or consular post. 10.21. Incomplete, altered, unsigned, or late-delivered documentation will not be accepted.

## 11. REGISTRATION

11.1. Once the candidate's eligibility has been verified after document review, the post will register them in SISPEC, observing the deadline stipulated in item 6 of this Notice.

11.2. To register in SISPEC, the post must:

- a) correctly fill in the candidate's data required by the system;
- b) send the candidate's complete and correct digitized documentation to the system;
- c) indicate the PEC modality(ies) in which the candidate wishes to register, as per item 11.3 of this Notice; and
- d) indicate the specific course or place option the candidate wishes to apply for, as per item 11.5 of this Notice.

11.3. The candidate may apply:

- a) only for the PEC-G program, to fill a place in an undergraduate course starting in the first or second semester of 2027, in which case they must meet the requirements specified in subparagraph "g" of item 4.2 or in item 4.2.1 of this Notice; or
- b) for both the PEC-PLE and PEC-G programs simultaneously, to fill a place in a Portuguese as a Foreign Language and Brazilian Culture course starting in the first semester of 2027 and a place in an undergraduate course starting in 2028, according to the academic calendar of the indicated IES.

11.4. Candidates who have taken Portuguese as an official language course throughout high school or equivalent level will be required to apply only for the PEC-G program, and their participation in the PEC-PLE program is prohibited.

11.4.1. The provisions of item 11.4 do not apply to candidates who have completed secondary education or equivalent level in Timor-Leste or Equatorial Guinea.

11.5. Candidates wishing to apply only for the PEC-G program must indicate, in their application:

a) one undergraduate course option, without specifying a particular institution or city, in which case they will compete for all places offered for the chosen course and similar courses, according to the list of places published on the DCE/MRE website; or

b) one specific undergraduate place option (course, institution, campus, undergraduate modality, shift, and semester of entry), in which case they will compete exclusively for the indicated place.

11.6. Candidates wishing to apply for both the PEC-PLE and PEC-G programs must indicate, in their application, one undergraduate course option, without specifying a particular institution or city, in which case they will compete for all places offered for the chosen course and similar courses, according to the list of places published on the DCE/MRE website.

11.6.1. Candidates for the PEC-PLE and PEC-G programs may also indicate a specific Higher Education Institution (IES) for the Portuguese as a Foreign Language and Brazilian Culture course, in which case they will compete exclusively for the indicated PEC-PLE place. If they do not indicate a PEC-PLE IES option, they will compete for all available PEC-PLE places.

11.7. Only applications submitted within the deadlines defined in item 6 of this Notice will be accepted.

11.8. The registration will be approved upon presentation of complete and correct documentation in SISPEC.

11.9. The MEC and MRE are not responsible for technical problems or failures that prevent the completion of the registration or the submission of documentation to SISPEC, including those resulting from system instability, communication failures, or other factors beyond the control of the ministries.

## 12. SELECTION

12.1. The final evaluation of applications will be carried out by a Selection Committee established by means of a Administrative Order issued by SESu/MEC.

12.2. The Selection Committee will be responsible for analyzing the conformity of each application with the objectives of the Program.

12.3. The selection will involve analysis of the academic transcript and other application documents required in item 10.2 of this Notice, observing the limit of selected candidates expressed in item 2.1, as well as the following minimum requirements:

a) proof of nationality from one of the countries participating in the PEC-G, indicated in item 16 of this Notice;

b) overall average of 60% (sixty percent) in high school or equivalent level;

c) sum of the monthly amounts promised by the financial guarantor(s) equivalent to at least US\$ 300.00 (three hundred US dollars);

d) Proof of net monthly income for each financial guarantor equivalent to at least three times the monthly amount individually promised to the candidate, except in cases where the financial guarantor is a public legal entity;

e) In the case of a financial guarantor who undertakes to finance more than one candidate, the proof of net monthly income must be equivalent to at least three times the sum of the monthly amounts promised to all candidates under their responsibility;

f) For candidates who have studied Portuguese as an official language throughout the equivalent of high school, except for candidates who have completed high school or equivalent level in Timor-Leste or Equatorial Guinea: intermediate, upper-intermediate, advanced, or upper-advanced level as measured by the Celpe-Bras exam, in the case of candidates who possess the certificate, or an intermediate level in a Portuguese language course taught by a local unit of the Instituto Guimarães Rosa (IGR) network, or an overall average in the Portuguese language subject of high school or equivalent level of 65% (sixty-five percent); or

g) for other candidates: intermediate, upper-intermediate, advanced, or upper-advanced level as measured by the Celpe-Bras exam, in the case of candidates who possess the certificate, or an intermediate level in a Portuguese language course taught by a local unit of the Instituto Guimarães Rosa (IGR) network, or an overall average in the official language of their country in secondary education or an equivalent level of 60% (sixty percent).

12.4. The MEC and MRE will be responsible for presenting the parameters for converting exchange rates, grades, and mentions of the countries participating in the Program for equivalence with the Brazilian system.

12.5. In order to meet the objective of the Program to support the internationalization of participating IES, the Selection Committee will seek to promote the balanced distribution of selected candidates among the different regions of Brazil, as well as among the IES offering places in this Selection Process and the semesters of entry into the courses.

12.6. In allocating places, the Selection Committee will seek to observe the maximum number of candidates allocated to each higher education institution, as previously informed by the institutions.

12.7. For courses where the number of applicants exceeds the number of available places, the Selection Committee will seek to promote diversity of countries of origin among the selected candidates, especially in courses with higher demand, observing the classification criteria established in this Notice.

12.8. The following criteria will be used to classify candidates, without prejudice to additional criteria to be defined by the Selection Committee:

a) overall relative average of secondary education or equivalent level, calculated by the difference between the candidate's overall average and the overall average of all candidates from their country; and

b) level measured in the Celpe-Bras exam, in the case of candidates who possess the certificate; or overall average in the official language subject of secondary education or equivalent level, in the case of candidates who do not possess the certificate.

12.9. Among candidates from countries where the Celpe-Bras exam is administered, priority will be given to those who possess the aforementioned certificate.

12.10. Candidates registered only for the PEC-G program who have submitted proof of registration for the first semester 2026 edition of the Celpe-Bras exam and have not obtained certification in said exam will be disqualified.

12.11. The existence of a place does not constitute a right or expectation of right in this Selection Process. The selection of a candidate depends on the Committee's understanding that their profile is suitable for the Program's proposal.

12.12. Candidates for the PEC-G program who are considered eligible but not selected will be placed on a waiting list for the specific courses or places indicated in their registration, observing the order of classification established in the selection process.

### 13. RESULTS

13.1. The documents regarding the results of the 2026 Selection Process for PEC-G and PEC-PLE (entry in 2027) will be published on the electronic pages of DCE/MRE (<https://www.gov.br/mre/pt-br/assuntos/cultura-e-educacao/temas-educacionais/oportunidades-de-estudo-para-estrangeiros/pec-g/processo-seletivo>) and MEC (<https://www.gov.br/mec/pt-br/pec>).

13.2. The list of candidates selected in the first call, as well as the list of remaining places available and any waiting list for the 2026 Selection Process for PEC-G and PEC-PLE (entry in 2027), will be released from the date defined in item 6 of this notice.

13.2.1. The selected candidates will be informed of:

a) for those who will attend the PEC-PLE program: the PEC-PLE place (institution and city) granted and the undergraduate course whose place (institution and city) will be assigned later, in 2027; and

b) for those who will only attend the PEC-G program: the undergraduate place (course, institution, city, shift, modality, and semester of entry) granted.

13.2.2. The list of remaining places will consist of vacant positions whose occupation is aligned with the objectives of the Program to support the internalization of internationalization.

13.3. Those selected in the first call must, within a deadline to be indicated by the post where they registered, communicate with the aforementioned representation to express acceptance, withdrawal, request for alteration of the offered places to places on the list of remaining places, or request inclusion on the waiting list for a place occupied by another candidate.

13.4. The selection centers must register the expressions of interest from those selected in the first round in SISPEC, within the timeframe defined in item 6 of this Notice.

13.5. The confirmation of those selected in the first round, as registered by the selection centers in SISPEC, as well as the updated waiting list, if any, will be published after the period for expressions of interest from those selected and the filling of any places resulting from withdrawals, according to the schedule set forth in item 6 of this Notice.

13.6. Vacancies opened by any withdrawals or eliminations of candidates after the confirmation of those selected in the first round may, at the discretion of SESu/MEC and DCE/MRE, be offered

to candidates on the waiting list, according to the ranking defined by the Selection Committee, in accordance with item 12 of this Notice.

13.7. Any lists of candidates selected in the second or third round, to fill places opened by withdrawals or eliminations of those selected in the first round, will be published within the timeframe defined in item 6 of this Notice.

#### 14. GUIDANCE FOR SELECTED CANDIDATES

14.1 It is the sole responsibility of the selected candidate to:

- a) regularly check the email address provided in their application to confirm receipt of instructions from the IES to which they have been assigned;
- b) follow the IES' instructions regarding enrollment and other procedures, including stipulated deadlines, under penalty of elimination from the Program;
- c) contact the IES, if necessary, using the contact information to be published on the DCE/MRE website, to obtain information about their enrollment and the need for translation into Portuguese of the documents required for initial registration;
- d) be fully responsible for organizing their trip and stay in Brazil, including expenses for issuing documents, consular services, airfare, housing, and living expenses throughout their participation in the Program; e) to enroll in the place(ies) accepted, as indicated in the list of selected candidates for this Selection Process.

14.2. It is the responsibility of the Higher Education Institutions (IES):

- a) to forward to the Ministry of Education (MEC), within the deadline stipulated by the MEC, updated information regarding the institutional coordination of the Program in the modalities in which it participates, as well as the academic calendar, contact information and other requested data, for publication on the DCE/MRE website;
  - a.1) IES that, for administrative reasons, do not have the definitive dates of the academic calendar within the deadline for the MEC to gather the information must, nevertheless, respond to the inquiry, presenting estimated dates. Under no circumstances may the request be ignored;
- b) to send the selected candidate information regarding enrollment, academic calendar, institutional rules and other information relevant to the arrival and stay of the exchange student;
- e
- c) inform the MEC (Ministry of Education) of the results obtained by PEC-PLE students in the Celpe-Bras exam, indicating the level of proficiency achieved, when there is approval, as well as the authorization or denial of granting a new opportunity to take the exam.

14.3. Candidates who do not enroll within the deadline defined by the IES (Higher Education Institution) will lose the right to the place(ies) for which they were selected in this Selection Process and will not be able to enter the Program, and must reapply in future selection processes.

14.4. For initial registration at the IES, the selected candidate must present the following documents, without prejudice to any additional documents that may be required by the IES:

- a) Letter of Introduction issued by the post where they registered, according to the model available on the DCE/MRE website;
- b) Birth or Marriage Certificate, duly apostilled (if the country is a signatory to the Hague Apostille Convention) or legalized (if the country is not a signatory to the Hague Apostille Convention);
- c) High school diploma or equivalent, duly apostilled (if the country is a signatory to the Hague Apostille Convention) or legalized (if the country is not a signatory to the Hague Apostille Convention);
- d) High school transcript or equivalent, duly apostilled (if the country is a signatory to the Hague Apostille Convention) or legalized (if the country is not a signatory to the Hague Apostille Convention);
- e) Commitment Form for Enrollment, according to the model available on the DCE/MRE website, completed and signed by the selected candidate;
- f) Declaration of Financial Responsibility(s), issued less than three months prior to the initial registration date at the Higher Education Institution (IES), completed and signed by the financial guarantor(s), with the signatory's signature notarized by a notary public or competent authority;
- g) Updated proof(s) of net monthly income of the financial guarantor(s), except in the case of students financed by a public legal entity;
- h) Official identification document, with photo and signature, of the signatory(ies) of the Declaration of Financial Responsibility(s);
- i) Medical certificate of physical and mental health, issued less than three months prior to the initial registration date at the Higher Education Institution (IES), signed and stamped by a qualified professional, attesting that the candidate is fit to study abroad and stating whether the candidate has any relevant health condition, including chronic diseases, continuous use of medication or regular medical follow-up, as well as any disability, under the terms of the Brazilian Inclusion Law (Law No. 13.146/2015), with a description of the type and degree, when applicable, observing the provisions of Law No. 13.709, of August 14, 2018 (General Law on the Protection of Personal Data - LGPD);
- j) Registration in the Individual Taxpayer Registry (CPF);
- k) Passport with appropriate temporary visa, when necessary, or, in the case of a student who has completed the PEC-PLE program, a valid temporary CRNM (National Migration Registration Card) or proof of renewal of the CRNM with the Federal Police; and
- l) For admission to the PEC-G program for candidates who have not taken Portuguese as an official language throughout the equivalent of high school: certificate of approval in the Celpe-Bras exam or an Intermediate level certificate in a Portuguese language course taught by a local unit of the Instituto Guimarães Rosa (IGR) network.

14.5. In the case of a student who has completed the PEC-PLE program, the medical certificate of physical and mental health for registration in the undergraduate program may be issued in Brazil.

14.6. The data contained in the candidate's medical certificate of physical and mental health will be used solely within the scope of this selection process, exclusively for the purpose of informing the Higher Education Institutions (IES) so that, to the extent of their possibilities, they may provide appropriate support and assistance to students who need support for health reasons. It is important that the certificate presents relevant and accurate information about the candidate's physical and mental health.

14.6.1. The personal and sensitive personal data collected will be used strictly for the evaluation of enrollment conditions, adoption of accessibility, inclusion and support measures, and other measures necessary for the execution of the Program, and its use for any other purpose is prohibited.

14.6.2. Personal and sensitive personal data will be kept for the period necessary for the execution of the selection process and, after the termination of the student's relationship with the Program, will be deleted or anonymized, except in cases of mandatory retention provided for in applicable legislation, observing the archiving standards of the Federal Public Administration.

14.7. The Declaration of Financial Responsibility(s) will be considered valid for the entire period that the exchange student remains in Brazil linked to the Program, provided that it/they are accompanied by updated proof(s) of net monthly income of the financial guarantor(s), except in the case of a student financed by a public legal entity.

14.8. The documents mentioned in items 10.13, 10.14 and 10.15 of this Notice may be accepted as proof of income.

14.9. The method of sending, receiving and validating the documents listed in item 14.4 will be defined by the IES to which the candidate has been assigned, observing the institution's internal rules.

14.9.1. The Higher Education Institution (IES) may authorize the submission and full validation of documentation in digital format, including through a specific electronic form sent to the candidate before their arrival in Brazil, and may, at its discretion, waive the presentation of physical documents and authenticated copies.

14.9.2. Alternatively, the IES may require the presentation of original documents, authenticated copies, and/or physical delivery at the time of in-person academic registration, according to its internal rules and procedures.

14.10. The IES may periodically request the presentation of updated income statements from the financial guarantor(s) of the student-sharing partner, in order to verify the continuity of the financial conditions required for participation in the Program.

## 15. GENERAL PROVISIONS

15.1. The candidate's registration implies acceptance of the rules and conditions established in this Notice, in Decree No. 11,923 of February 15, 2024, and in Interministerial Ordinance MEC/MRE No. 7 of June 4, 2024, regarding which the candidate may not claim ignorance.

15.2. Failure to meet all the criteria established in this Notice will result in the candidate's disqualification by the Selection Committee.

15.3. Any candidate who has demonstrably used false documents and/or information or other illicit means to participate in the 2026 Selection Process for PEC-G and PEC-PLE (entry in 2027) will be eliminated at any time, even after enrollment.

15.4. The candidate's selection in this Selection Process does not guarantee the obtaining of the appropriate visa for entry and residence in Brazil. It is the responsibility of the selected candidate to demonstrate that they possess the necessary means to meet all the visa requirements stipulated by the relevant Brazilian legislation, as well as to submit complete documentation to the Brazilian consular authorities in their country of registration for the evaluation of the visa application.

15.5. The procedures for validating the higher education diploma obtained through participation in the PEC-G program are the responsibility of the program graduate.

15.6. Additional information regarding the 2026 Selection Process for PEC-G and PEC-PLE (entry in 2027), including the activity calendar, can be obtained on the DCE/MRE website (<https://www.gov.br/mre/pt-br/assuntos/cultura-e-educacao/temas-educacionais/oportunidades-de-estudo-para-estrangeiros/pec-g/processo-seletivo>).
